EXPORTING MEDICAL EDUCATION IN TODAY'S REALITY

As international relations are strengthened, universities in Russia and Africa have committed to developing and strengthening collaboration of an academic and scientific nature. Such collaboration hinges on the export of educational programmes, the promotion of academic and clinical mobility, and the exchange of modern medical technology as well as the introduction of cutting-edge digital solutions, telemedicine, and information technologies. Russia is actively investing resources to contribute to the professional development of the medical community in Africa, which has historically enjoyed a wellestablished professional educational system that continues to develop through the Moscow initiative and special Russian programme among others. Russia's educational agenda for Africa currently includes the training of highly qualified specialists in the important areas of public health, biotechnology, genetics, neuro-technology, artificial intelligence, bio-safety, and epidemiological security. Efforts on the part of African nations to improve quality of life require a systematic approach to nurturing the managerial competencies of healthcare leaders guiding the sector's transformation. What can be done to increase opportunities for integration between countries? What innovative approaches are currently being introduced in the training of healthcare workers in Africa? What support measures could further help efforts to export medical education to Africa? What are the current challenges facing institutions of higher education in Russia and Africa? What can we do to ensure technological sovereignty and competitiveness in education?

PHARMACEUTICAL INDUSTRY AND HEALTHCARE: INTERNATIONAL PLATFORMS FOR REGULATORY COOPERATION

In the context of globalization of the world healthcare system, cooperation to ensure that Russia and African countries have modern, effective, and safe drugs becomes an important issue. In this regard, it is crucial to note the importance of countries harmonizing their regulatory approaches in terms of registering and supplying drugs in order to exchange productive experience and determine further areas for the development of international cooperation. Creating an independent platform to exchange professional knowledge and practical experience, building trust, and identifying common approaches in good practices should help level out existing restrictions and provide equal opportunities for all participants.

Do experts currently have any national or political restrictions in cooperation concerning the production and circulation of drugs? What experience do Russia and Africa have in creating international platforms for interaction between regulators? What aspects of registering and supplying drugs are typical for different countries of the African region? What socially significant drugs are of interest to the healthcare systems of African countries?

DRUG SECURITY FOR PEOPLE'S HEALTH AND LIVES

The desired amount of public funding for medicines and other medical technologies always exceeds the available resources in all healthcare systems, regardless of a country's level of economic development. This problem forces public healthcare systems to choose the most effective medicines from a clinical and economic standpoint with a limited budget. The determining factors in decision-making are: the availability and effectiveness of medicines; the ability to obtain modern drugs; the quality control and shelf life of medicines; monitoring the storage conditions of drugs; compliance with the requirements for prescribing drugs; considerations of the risks associated with using drugs; the process of providing drugs to the public, including certain groups of citizens; medical registries; and the population's level of medical literacy. Constant improvements need to be made to the system used to increase efficient funding by optimizing the choice of medicines, taking into account the peculiarities of new technologies. Combining the experience that Russia has accumulated in drug provision and exchanging best practices between Russia and African countries could contribute to the more sustainable use of the healthcare system's resources. How can we ensure the availability of drug therapy today? What are the limitations of health technology assessment models? What further steps need to be taken to ensure the drug security of Russia and African countries?

ADVANCED MEDICAL DEVICES: FOCUSING ON EXPORTS

High-tech medical products are becoming increasingly important in modern medicine. The African continent is one of the most attractive markets for Russian companies that produce medical products in terms of sales and long-term investments. In recent years, African countries have made a huge leap in creating conditions for business development and a favourable investment climate. Meanwhile, government measures to support Russian producers with existing benefits and subsidies are actively stimulating the development of the national industry and helping to significantly expand the geography of exports. Notably, the leading players on the Russian market for medical products and the beneficiaries of cooperation with African countries are not just offering one-off export deals, but projects that include both the supply and maintenance of products, as well as the training of specialists, possible technology transfers, and partial localization. What is the current geography for Russian exports of medical devices and technologies? What are some of the specific features of the export, logistics, and distribution of Russian-made medical products to African countries? What measures are being taken to lift regulatory and other barriers in the supply of medical devices to African markets? What opportunities are there for Russian manufacturers from the localization of individual production facilities in African countries?
